Explanatory Notes

- You are required to declare whether you have ever had a criminal record.
- You must declare any criminal convictions.
They are never regarded as spent when you are applying to study or work as a nurse or midwife.
- Answer the questions honestly. Having a criminal record does not automatically prevent you from obtaining a place on a nursing or midwifery course. Each case will be considered individually.
Failure to disclose a conviction, bind-over, or caution can result in the withdrawal of an offer, termination of your course, or disciplinary action.

Important information for applicants from outside the United Kingdom

If you do not hold a degree or diploma from a British university, you need to submit a 1,000 word original essay, in your own handwriting, reflecting on experiences that demonstrate your ability to join this graduate course and become a midwife. This essay should demonstrate your potential to study at higher levels and should be referenced using the Harvard system of referencing or another recognised system ie Vancouver.
