

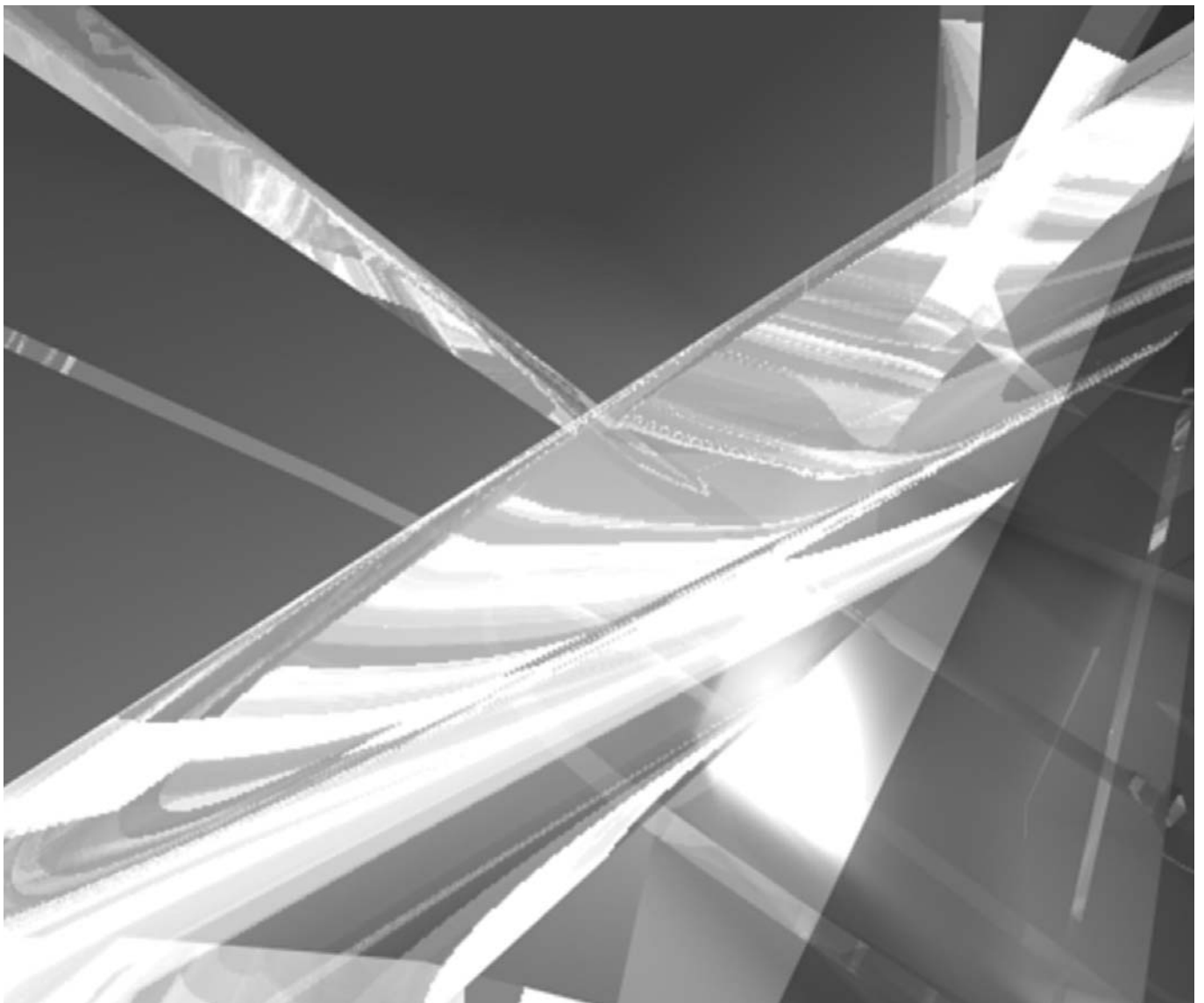

6. Dominant 7ths in the keys of C, C#, D, Eb, E, F, F# and G, resolving on the tonic, to be played in even notes:
 - (i) separate bows
 - (ii) slurred, 12 notes to a bowRange: 3 octaves.
7. Diminished 7ths starting on any G, G#, A, Bb, B, C, C# and D, to be played in even notes:
 - (i) separate bows
 - (ii) slurred, 12 notes to a bow.Range: 3 octaves.
