

Guidance and Support for Care Experienced Students

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Welcome to the University of West London

Studying at university is an exciting, enlightening and extremely rewarding experience. You will have the opportunity to specialise in an academic field, develop skills to help you in your future career and personal life, take part in a wide range of extracurricular activities and make new friends. As you take this step, it is important to have information on the assistance available to you.

At the University of West London (UWL) we support students of all ages and backgrounds to succeed in higher education. We understand that the experience of Care Experienced Students (CES) may differ from other students and there may be specific areas in which you would like further information.

This guide has been designed to provide you with key information to aid you in your decision to attend university, as well as details of the support available to CES should you wish to access this. Be sure to read through this guide and start your preparations for life as a university student.

The University of West London defines a Care Experienced Student as:

- a person who has been living with foster carers or in a children's home for at least 13 weeks and who was in care on their 16th birthday.
- a person preparing to leave the care of their local authority and coming to university on a full time basis to study an undergraduate course (first degree).
- a person who has told us about their care background and will be able to provide evidence that they have been in care.



Pre-entry support

Application advice and guidance

Choosing to go to university is an important decision. UWL can provide impartial advice regarding your application to the University, courses available, funding, budgeting and welfare support. As a Care Experienced Student you can speak to us to help you make informed decisions about the options available to you.

We can support you with a number of areas including your personal statement, applying to our accommodation or visiting sites for a bespoke tour.

Post-entry support

Funding

The main student finance package is from Student Finance England (SFE) for a new student starting in September or in January and includes:

- Tuition Fee Loan
- Maintenance Loan.
- Supplementary grants according to your specific situation. If you have dependent children, disability and learning difficulties.

There are also additional sources of financial support that you can apply for directly from the University. These include:

Full-time Undergraduate Bursary Scheme

UWL provides up to 400 bursaries to UWL full-time undergraduate students.

The bursary consists of a £1,500 award payable over three academic years. Student receive £500 (per academic year) towards the cost of study, including the cost of learning materials, catering outlets, accommodation and transport costs. Further details can be found at:

Care Experienced Student Bursary

If you are from a care background, you may be eligible to receive a £500 award for each academic year you attend UWL over the first three years. As well as support with accomodation and living costs.

To be eligible for the CES Bursary, you will need to be a UK home fee paying student, under 25 years of age and have spent a minimum of 13 weeks in the care of a UK local authority with at least one day being since the age of 14, including on or after your 16th birthday.

Discretionary Support Fund

This is a discretionary fund to support students in times of financial hardship. Whilst this support is not guaranteed, Care Experienced Students are one of the priority groups for receipt of this fund.

Accommodation

We understand how important it is for our students to have a secure, suitable living environment whilst studying.

Care Experienced Students are made a priorty for student accommodation. We can also support students to find private accommodation should they wish.

Students who will be commencing their studies at UWL can apply for student accomodation with our local purpose built student accommodation providers.

Chapter White City and Holbrook are located in either North Acton or East Acton, with quick access to Ealing Broadway station and the UWL shuttle bus to our Ealing and Brentford sites.

We also offer a range of university-managed shared flats and houses and accommodation at the Student Village and Reynard Mills. These options are perfect for groups of friends who want to get their own place or for individuals who are looking for something a bit different.

Student support and mentoring service

UWL offers a mentoring service to all students. Having a mentor is one of the best ways to help you acclimatise to university life and maximise your student experience, academically and socially. If you wish to access this service you will be paired with a student mentor who has already progressed further on their course and who will be able to provide ongoing support through regular meetings. They can share their experience of university life and their course to help you gain a greater understanding of what is required.

Frequently asked questions

How can I find out more about the UWL to help me decide if I want to apply?

Attending an open day will give you the chance to have a tour of the University and its facilities. You will find out more about the courses available and have your questions answered by staff and students. Alternatively if you have a specific question or concern you can contact Krishna for information and support (see page 4 for details).

How do I provide evidence that I have been in care?

To ensure you get the best support from both your local authority and from the University we will ask you for a letter from your social worker confirming that you are a Care Experienced Student OR you can instead choose to complete a short form detailing which local authority you were in care with. This information will only be viewed by the Welfare and Advice student support team and is simply used to verify your eligibility and ensure you are able to access the support available to you.

Will you share my personal information?

Any information that you share with us will be treated confidentially unless you give permission for the information to be shared. This will not affect your application to us.

We understand that some students prefer not to be identified as a Care Experienced Student. The support available for Care Experienced Students is confidential and discreet. You can take up as much or as little support as you wish to.

Care Experienced Student Bursary Application

The bursary of £500 will be in installments for the first three academic years you enroll. Timing of payments may be agreed. This does not have to be repaid. This bursary is to help you towards your accommodation and living costs.

The payment for your CES Bursary will be made by the University to the same bank account which you use to receive your Student Finance payments. Therefore, your Student Finance will need to have been processed and approved before your CES Bursary payment can be made to you. We advise you to make your Student Finance application in advance of the start of each academic year at UWL as soon as you are able - ideally at least two months before you are due to start the academic year. This should ensure that your Student Finance is processed in good time by Student Loans Company and that you have a base level of financial support throughout your studies at UWL, as well as being able to receive your CES Bursary payments.

Guidance notes for completing your application form

Section 1:

Please fill in your personal details in CAPITAL letters. All correspondence will be sent via your UWL email account.

Section 2:

In this section you need to tick the correct box. If you tick that you are or have been in Local Authority Care, you will need to state the name of the Local Authority.

Section 3:

Please tick the correct box. In order to be eligible for the Care Experienced Student Bursary, you need to be a UK home fee paying student, under 25 years of age and spent a minimum of 13 weeks in the care of a UK local authority with at least one day being since the age of 14, including on or after your 16th birthday.

Section 4:

In order for your application to be considered, you MUST provide original hard copy evidence of your Care Experienced Student status from your Local Authority. Tick to ensure you have included your documents.

Section 5:

Please tick and sign to verify you have read the form carefully and ensured that all information entered is correct. False, forged or misleading information will automatically disqualify your application.
